God is personal, so we are personal with him and with each other.

The rule for being personal is to say *something* when you are given access to someone's treasures. What guides our response is both the golden rule and humility.

Be personal – that is, move toward people, know others, be moved by those things that are important.

One certain way to be personal is to pray. Pray for and with people

Example: Your friend is speaking about a work struggle.

"This seems pretty hard. How can I pray for you?"

"You could pray that I would be able to find work soon"

"Could I pray for you now
